UPDATE: Arrest made in Medicine Lodge homicide

KINGMAN COUNTY – The Kansas Bureau of Investigation (KBI), the Medicine Lodge Police Department, and the Barber County Sheriff's Office announced an arrest connected to the homicide of Joyce Foulkrod.

Today, Thursday, August 20, at approximately 5:15 p.m., KBI agents served an arrest warrant to 34-year-old Clinton W. Rogers for suspected premeditated first-degree murder. The warrant was executed at the Kingman County Jail, where Rogers was previously in custody for alleged theft.

At the request of the Barber County Attorney, the Kansas Attorney General's Office's will prosecute the case. Any further information related to this case is expected to come from the Attorney General's Office.

The investigation is ongoing. Nothing further will be released at this time.

UPDATE: Person of interest in homicide now in custody in Montana

GLENDIVE, Mont. – The Kansas Bureau of Investigation (KBI), the Medicine Lodge Police Department, and the Barber County Sheriff's Office have located the person of interest they have been searching for, who is believed connected to the homicide of Joyce Foulkrod.

Clinton W. Rogers, 34, was located Tuesday, Aug. 11, in Glendive, Mont. He was arrested by the Dawson County Sheriff's Office at approximately 10:30 p.m. (CDT) on a warrant for theft out of Kingman County, Kan. He is currently being held in the Dawson County Jail.

KBI agents are traveling to Montana, where they will question Rogers. The investigation is ongoing. Nothing further will be released at this time.

UPDATE: Person of interest believed to be traveling in new vehicle

Clinton W. Rogers, 34, stole a dark red 1995 Chevrolet Camaro with t-tops in Kingman County on Sunday. It is possible that the Camaro is still bearing Kansas license plate, 870JUK. Rogers is no longer traveling in the white F-150 pickup truck.

UPDATE: KBI attempting to locate man connected to homicide in Medicine Lodge

BARBER COUNTY- The Kansas Bureau of Investigation (KBI), the Medicine Lodge Police Department, and the Barber County Sheriff's Office are requesting the public's help to locate a person of interest connected to a homicide that occurred in Medicine Lodge.

Authorities are looking for Clinton Wayne Rogers and his 2002 white Ford extended cab F-150 pickup truck with possible Kansas license plate, 870JUK.

Clinton Rogers is a 34-year-old white male with hazel eyes. He is 6 ft. 1 in. tall, and weighs approximately 270 lbs.

Homicide investigation in Medicine Lodge

BARBER COUNTY- The Kansas Bureau of Investigation (KBI), the Medicine Lodge Police Department, and the Barber County Sheriff's Office are investigating after a Medicine Lodge woman was found dead Monday afternoon.

The Medicine Lodge Police Department requested KBI assistance at approximately 2 p.m. Monday, July 27. Special agents and the Crime Scene Response Team responded.

Just before 1:50 p.m., a family member called 911 after finding 61-year-old Joyce A. Foulkrod deceased inside her home at 3 Whitney Ln., in Medicine Lodge. EMS, the Medicine Lodge Police Department, and the Barber County Sheriff's Office responded. EMS pronounced her dead at the scene.

Preliminary information leads investigators to believe Foulkrod's death was a homicide. An autopsy will be conducted Tuesday.
